Under immediate supervision and in a trainee capacity, incumbents in this class series assist in the activities of a County department in a specific vocational or career field.

Students working for the Environmental Management Department could be selected to work in the Divisions of Environmental Health, Hazardous Materials or Water Protection, and must be working toward a degree in a science major such as Biology, Geology, Chemistry, or a related field.

Employees in student classes work part-time, no more than 24 hours per week, during the school term. They may work full time, 40 hours per week, during summer and school vacation weeks and after graduation.

Students must provide verification of full-time enrollment in an accredited college or university.

Sacramento County

Sacramento is located in the north central part of the state, a short distance from the San Francisco Bay area, the Napa Valley, and the Sierra Nevada Mountains. Sacramento also enjoys the recreational waters of the American and Sacramento Rivers. It is a growing community with affordable housing and a booming economy. Benefits

- **Benefits** - There are **no** paid medical, dental, vision, or life insurance benefits.
- **Deferred Compensation** – Temporary employees, such as Student Interns, pay 3.75% of their wages into a Deferred Compensation account, and are matched by the County. The funds are paid to the temporary employee at the time of separation from the County.
- **Vacation** - 3.1 hours of vacation are earned for every eighty hours worked.

Minimum Qualifications:

Full-time enrollment in an accredited college or university, with the following number of units for each level:

Freshman
0 – 30 semester units
or
0 – 45 quarter units

Sophomore
31 – 60 semester units
or
46 – 90 quarter units

Junior
61 – 90 semester units
or
91 – 135 quarter units

Senior
91 + semester units
or
136 + quarter units

Graduate
A Bachelor's degree or higher and current full-time enrollment in an accredited graduate program.

Appointments to Junior, Senior, and Graduate levels are limited to students enrolled in a program leading to a four-year or advanced degree. Students enrolled in a program leading to a certificate or an Associate's degree are limited to appointment to Freshman and Sophomore levels.
